

Saint Francis Xavier (1506-1552) extensively traveled across Asia to preach, provide pastoral support to Europeans, and bring Christian salvation to indigenous peoples. His journey has brought many people and institutions to project in him a number of narratives and ideals. Francis Xavier can stand as a symbol of missionary zeal, an embodiment of what a Jesuit represents, a man of dialogue between cultures, and a Western colonizer.

This conference explores the ways in which Asian peoples and institutions share stories about Francis Xavier, the narratives they build, and the type of devotional practices, cross regional pilgrimages, and secular museums that they establish in relation to him today.

By paying attention to the range of ideas and values behind these memorializing efforts, this conference aims at discussing the theological, social, and political significance of Francis Xavier in 21st century Asia.


